

How The Church's Past Leadership Processes Are Failing Equality Now is one of the most prominent human rights groups in the world and I, personally, know a few people who work for the organization. It's just that, when it comes to LGBT equality, the people at Equality Now have chosen to focus much more on attacking the Catholic Church than helping churches, particularly Catholic parishes, work towards acceptance. Recently, the most recent information in the above infographic showing that 1,000 Catholic priests are gay or bisexual has been used to attack the Catholic Church and the organizations that are trying to help people accept LGBT people. I feel like I need to set the record straight. That 1,000 figure is exaggerated and misleading. It's not true. It's not even close to being true. The Council of the Roman Catholic Church released a new document in November 2014 called "Don't Ask, Don't Tell" which instructed bishops and other Catholic leaders around the world on the issue of homosexuality. The letter condemned "homosexual conduct" as "gravely contrary to the moral law" and exhorted leaders to avoid and prevent what the church regards as sinful sexual activity. It continued to speak out against the "continued acts of violence committed against persons of different sexual orientations." But it stopped short of explicitly condemning homosexuality itself as sinful and, at most, only gave the option of exclusion from the sacraments if the conduct was also "gravely contrary to the natural law." A few months later, the same group released a statement from the working group that had been meeting since 2012 to look at ways the Catholic Church can help homosexuals "in a full acceptance of their homosexual condition and a support of efforts to attain a just and peaceful coexistence." The statement reflected the group's conclusion that "the inalienable right to life of every human person" must be "respected and protected at all times," but it also said that 82157476af
